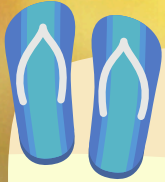

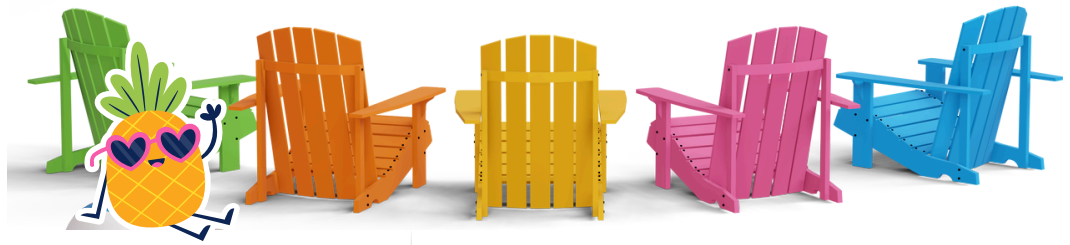

BOARD MEETINGS WRAP UP



The last few meetings have shown renewed interest in the NPNA and opened opportunities for membership and involvement in our neighborhood.

Ongoing concerns over speeding on Indian School, whether or not to have a playground and preserving the history of NP led to creation of sub-committees to aid in maintaining a cohesive community.

The **Committee to Calm Indian School Road** was formed and currently includes Carol Toffaleti, Amy Miller and Jason Kent.

The **Netherwood Park Developments Committee** currently includes Sandra Ortsman, Jason Kent, Michael Long and Galen Loughrey.

These neighbor run committees will independently meet, gather information and discuss options on their topics. They will present findings at the monthly NPNA board meetings which are held the 2nd Wednesday of each month. Developments from each committee will be available to all NP residents through the posted monthly meeting minutes, newsletters, special emails and the NPNA website. These members will be visible in the neighborhood as they gather information and opinions, so be sure to say hello and feel free to discuss these topics with them.

Communication to residents is always an important item at meetings. Redesigning the NPNA website is in the research phase with looking for a new webhost and a designer.

We want the site to truly reflect the history of our neighborhood while keeping our residents informed of current and future events and all resources available in one easy location.

The newsletter is now delivered to you via our NPNA email list and on the website. We have moved away from hand delivery in order to save printing and mailing expenses, while being able to provide you with more content.

While the playground option is currently on hold, the much-needed update to the sprinkler system is moving forward. Christian Mathias of Parks & Rec says, “Replacing an outdated irrigation system is a crucial step in maintaining the health, beauty, and functionality of a city park, benefiting both the environment and the community. Modern systems can be programmed to adapt to weather conditions, ensuring that the park's landscape receives optimal watering throughout the year.

This adaptability can also help manage water restrictions during dry periods. To minimize disruption, The City will be fencing off the western portion of the park, ensuring the east side remains open for food truck events throughout the summer.

Signs will be posted to inform the community about the ongoing work. After the summer, The City will close the east portion of the park to complete the remaining work”.

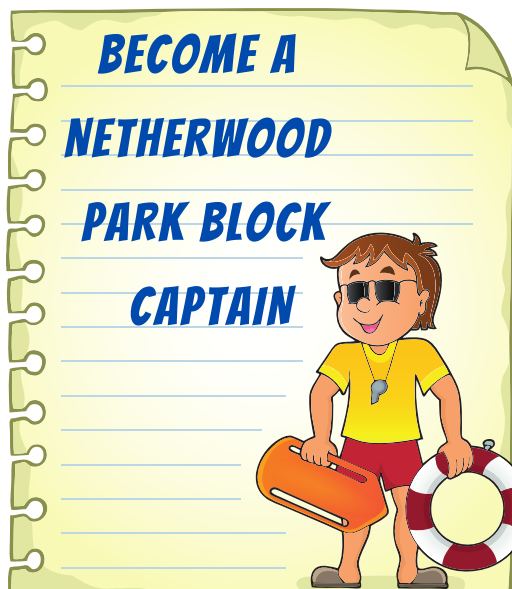


and stabilization of archeological resources require the ongoing attention for every location. Protection and rehabilitation of the sites, research opportunities, a virtual lecture series, and educational tours represent some of what this 401c3 offers, which provides membership packages and accepts donations to fund its work. The Conservancy recruits volunteer site stewards to assist in watching over preserves and to conduct tours. Stewards are usually neighbors or local avocational archaeologists who are interested in preservation. Several states in the SW region including Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Colorado, and Utah have statewide volunteer site steward programs with whom the Conservancy partners. Stewards are thoroughly trained regarding the archaeology of the particular preserve they protect.

Tucked away among the office buildings along Girard in our neighborhood is the headquarters of **The Archaeological Conservancy**. This fine organization has been around for over 40 years with the objective of acquiring and preserving significant archaeological sites across the United States.

Through the acquisition of private property via purchase, donation, or bequest, the conservancy has established nearly 600 preserves in 46 states, including Pueblo San Marcos in Santa Fe County. Preservation for each project is a continuous endeavor. Beginning with identification and land acquisition, management plans
